THE PROJECT

SUST-HEIn, Fostering whole institution approach to sustainability in HE through systems thinking is an Erasmus LS project that runs from January 2023 to October 2026

Sust-HEIn project aims to elevate the transition of HEIs in Greece, Cyprus, Italy and Spain to green, sustainable institutions, by fostering the whole-institution approach to sustainability through systems thinking. It aims to promote an institutional model to support HEIs' strategic planning to effectively respond to evolving needs and conditions to deliver systemic, institution-wide integration of sustainability, using systems thinking to analyze external and internal factors and their influence as well as where internal shifts are needed to respond to these factors.

The project, through transnational cooperation and mutual learning, will identify, develop, test and assess the whole institution approach to sustainability through systems thinking in the HE sector, which responds to the key European priorities of the European Green Deal (and education and training systems and institutions becoming catalysts for achieving the transition to a greener and more sustainable Europe), and of the European Education Area and sixth flagship action of the European Skills Agenda (on supporting the green transition); and it has the potential of becoming mainstreamed, thus improving the education systems, and the effectiveness of policies and practices in the field of education.

THE TRAINING ACTIVITY

Training of Trainers Seminar

This three-day seminar in Rome in October 2024 will equip selected staff from partner Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) with the necessary skills to become training multipliers. Participants will include administrative, academic, research staff, and PhD candidates. Upon completion, they will be responsible for disseminating the program's content at their respective institutions through national seminars.

National Seminars

Following the Training of Trainers Seminar, trained participants will organize three-day seminars in their home countries, targeting 10-15 relevant staff members. These seminars will replicate the content, ensuring wider program adoption and building long-term capacity within the partner institutions.

Together, these seminars form a cascading training model. The initial Training of Trainers Seminar enables further dissemination of knowledge and skills through National Seminars, amplifying the program's impact across multiple HEIs.

BY METRO: LINE A

Direction towards Battistini. Get off at the Cornelia stop. Walk for 10 minutes toward Villa Carpegna, reaching Via Gregorio VII, 601; alternatively, take bus 916 (Piazza Venezia) or 791 (Nervi / Palazzo Sport) for two stops to Villa Carpegna.



BY BUS

From Piazza della Repubblica (Termini train station):

Take bus 64 and get off at Cavalleggeri / San Pietro, then hop on bus 881, 916, or 98 and get off at Gregorio VII / Villa Carpegna.

From Piazza Venezia:

Take bus 916 (Andersen) and get off at Gregorio VII / Villa Carpegna.

From Palazzetto dello Sport - Nervi stop:

Take bus 791 (Cornelia) and get off at Gregorio VII / Villa Carpegna.



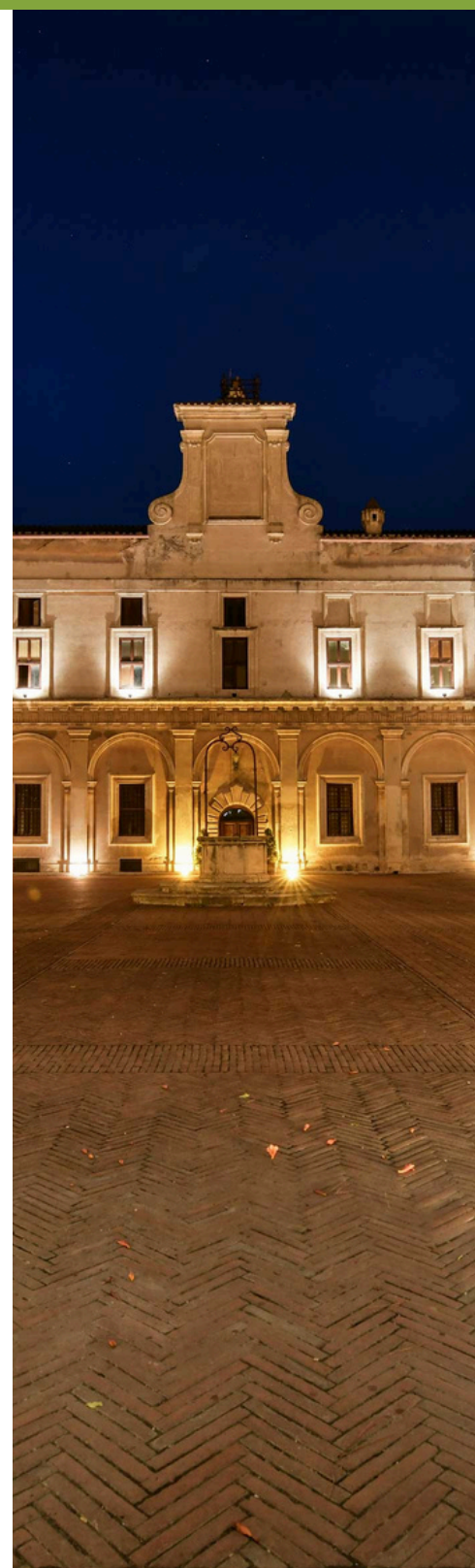
BY CAR

Those coming from the south (Naples), after entering the Grande Raccordo Anulare, can take:

- Exit 1 for SS1 towards Roma Centro-Aurelio / Aurelia / Porto Civitavecchia.
- Follow the signs for Roma Centro / Aurelio, / Città del Vaticano. Continue on Via Aurelia / State Road 1, from La Spezia / SS1.
- Take Via Aurelia Antica toward Via Gregorio VII.

Those coming from the north (Florence) can take:

- A1 / E35 in the direction of Strada Statale 1 Variante Aurelia of La Spezia in Rome.
- Take exit 1 from the A90. Continue on State Road 1 Variante Aurelia of La Spezia.
- Take Via Aurelia Antica toward Via Gregorio VII in Rome.
